Portland Doormakers Attempt Union

Doormakers at Pacific Architectural Wood Products organized their workplace in anticipation of a vote to unionize. The workers petitioned the National Labor Relations Board to conduct an election that would recognize Millworkers United as an independent union.

Alex Amen, an organizer with Mill Workers United, described how the boss responded to organization efforts: "So far the process since filing the NLRB petition has gone surprisingly smooth. The boss has put out a lot of nonsense anti-union fliers and the shop floor has been mostly laughing at them. We aren't engaging in the paper war and just continue driving the message of wages and safety."

Alex also added, "We are great friends with the Portland IWW and they have been very helpful in our process."

On Wednesday, October 26, workers voted against unionizing by a slim margin of 21 no votes to 17 yes votes.

Millworkers United Twitter account added after the election "We lost our vote, and we'll carry on...Our company has been doing business in NE Portland for 30 years. We tried, where no one else did, we failed."

Weyerhaeuser Strike Comes to an End

1,100 workers at Weyerhaeuser locations in Washington and Oregon went on strike on September 13th after the company failed to budge in negotiations regarding healthcare benefits and pay. The employees occupied 24/7 picket locations for 6 weeks, and a federal mediator was called in to oversee talks between workers and the company.

A tentative deal was reached and just 55% of the membership of IAMAW Woodworkers local 246 voted to accept the proposal.
